Apologetics Framework:

- 1) Truth is what is real
- 2) Not all religions can be true
- 3) Science points to a Creator
- 4) The Resurrection is a Historical event
- 5) There are really good reasons we can trust the Bible

The idea is you want them to see that truth exists, and it is illogical to say that all religions are true, science actually shows that the first miracle of God creating the universe out of nothing makes sense. We then can express that Christianity is a faith based on reason and evidence and there are several facts surrounding the Resurrection. Archaeology and History are showing us more and more that the Bible is what best explains the way the world is.

MINIMAL FACTS on the RESURRECTION:

- -Jesus died by Crucifixion
- -The disciples believed they saw the Risen Christ
- -The Christian church began and Sunday was now the primary day of worship
- -Very early sources saying it happened
- -Nearly all scholars believe the tomb was empty
